## <u>Critical Strategies to use in Teaching ELLs</u>

- 1. **Clearly defined language and content objectives** in lesson plans, posted on the board, explained to students.
- 2. **Meaningful language practice** include time for your students to interact and talk to one another. Allowing students to process with others who speak their same native language is also helpful.
- 3. Explain/teach difficult vocabulary and idioms encountered in lesson and materials.
- 4. **Be aware of language use and students' proficiency levels.** Implement: wait time, turn and talk, repetition, avoid idioms, etc.
- 5. Oral and written instructions for students to refer to.
- 6. Include visuals, manipulatives, realia.
- 7. Purposefully teach academic English skills.
- 8. Culturally relevant curriculum and materials are there examples or materials you can use that you know students will connect with culturally? AND/OR are there materials you can use that will expose students to diverse perspectives?
